

Magic Mornings FAQ

Q. What is a Magic Morning?

A. It's an opportunity for your child to visit Fairfield, meet staff and students, ask questions, and participate in two Key Stage 2 appropriate lessons with other primary students.

Q. What are the benefits of attending a Magic Morning?

A. Magic Mornings are designed to foster a sense of confidence about primary to secondary transition.

Q. Which years can attend?

A. September to March Magic Mornings are generally attended by Year 6 students. March to May Magic Mornings are generally attended by Year 5 students.

Q. What time are Magic Mornings?

A. Magic Mornings are from 9-11am. Participating students will be collected from and returned to their parent/carer outside the main doors in front of reception. After Magic Morning, your child returns to primary school for the rest of the day.

Q. What lessons are offered?

A. Each Magic Morning includes two lessons. Subjects may include Science, History, Foreign Language, English, Computer Science and Creative or Performing Arts. Students will find out which lessons they are attending when they arrive that morning.

Q. What should my child wear?

A. Please send your child in their school uniform.

Q. What does my child need to bring?

A. Your child is welcome to bring a water bottle. We will provide everything else.

Q. Who will my child be with during their Magic Morning?

A. They will be greeted and accompanied around the school by the transition team staff and attend lessons with Fairfield teachers.

Q. What if my child has special needs?

A. Magic Mornings are inclusive and accessible for all prospective students. Let us know during the registration process if your child has any additional/special needs, so we can make appropriate arrangements.

Q. How can parents/carers make the most of Magic Mornings?

A. Ask them to show you what they've brought home from their Magic Morning lessons. Chat with them about their experience.

Q. What information will I need to provide Fairfield when registering?

A. Child's name, Parent's name, Parent's email, Primary school, Year in school, Contact number, and SEN/Medical info.
