

Fairfield High School Curriculum Overview – Year 8

Subject	German	Why do we study these units in Year 8?
lessons per fortnight	3	Year 8 in German begins with leisure and shopping. We look to build on the skills, grammar, and vocabulary that students have learnt in Year 7. We recycle grammar structures and vocabulary from year 7 and reapply them to the units in year 8. This is with the aim of not only preparing students for the rigours of the GCSE German exam, but also to equip them with skills to learn other languages and become resilient, global citizens. Students in year 8 study leisure and shopping, house and home, school routine, free time and the media, holidays and health and lifestyle.
Setting	Tutor groups (mixed ability)	

Students are encouraged to be Responsible Global Citizens through activities/content on UN sustainable development goal 2: improved nutrition and goal 3: ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all. Students discuss social issues and consider the importance of healthy lifestyles and well-being and how to achieve them. (Term 6: Health & lifestyle)

UN sustainable development goal 16: promote peaceful and inclusive societies. Students look at using social media safely and life in their hometown. (Term 2: House and home and term 4: Free time and the media)

UN sustainable goal 4: quality education and UN sustainable goal 5: gender inequality. Students discuss access to education and learning pathways. (Term 3: School routine)

UN sustainable goal 12: responsible consumption and production. Students discuss food and drink consumption in other countries and their own (Term 1: Leisure and shopping)

UN sustainable development goal 6: clean water and sanitation, goal 7: affordable and clean energy, goal 13: climate change and its impact, goal 14: conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas and marine resources for sustainable development and goal 15: life on land. Students discuss environmental issues, sustainable travel and climate change. (Term 2: House and home and term 5: Holidays)

We ensure all students experience high challenge in the subject by including differentiated resources, questioning and extension tasks in lessons to allow our students to stretch themselves. In addition to this we set differentiated flipped learning tasks on Microsoft Teams. We also foster independent enquiry by providing students access to online material such as Linguascope and Blooket, where they can carry out additional subject practice.

Literacy work this year includes Key Stage appropriate grammar, spelling and pronunciation rules and use of vocabulary tests to allow students to feel confident with key words and phrases when they come up throughout the unit. We encourage the use of full sentences in speaking and writing and focus on both formal and informal register. We also use sentence builders to encourage correct use of word order, and these are labelled with key grammatical terms to aid students in their understanding of pronouns, verbs, adjectives, connectives etc. Termly literacy words and definitions are shared and recycled often in lessons.

Innovation and Creativity opportunities this year includes free writing and spontaneous speaking as well as studying foreign language films. Students are encouraged to present their work in a variety of ways.

Employability opportunities/skills covered this year are collaborative working, the ability to work independently and self-identifying areas to improve on. Students also have the chance to develop communication skills as well as gaining an understanding of formal and informal register.
